

Steps to Becoming a Student

#1 Apply Apply online at www.allencc.edu
Complete our free application online.
Submit all transcripts or GED diploma & test score, (ACT, ACCUPLACER, etc.).

#2 Test Take an assessment test
If you don't have an ACT test score, set up a placement testing appointment - call 620-365-5116 or 785.654.2416

#3 Fin. Aid Financial Aid
Your first step to secure financial aid is to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Apply online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Allen's school code number is 001901.

#4 Enroll Contact an advisor
An academic advisor will assist you in developing a plan and registering for your courses. Enrollment for the Fall 2018 semester begins April 2nd.

Important Dates

- Open enrollment for the Fall Semester begins on April 2, 2018
- Scholarship application priority deadline is April 1st for the fall semester.
- Make sure your FAFSA has been completed by May 1st to ensure arrival of your student loans/grants by the start of the semester
- Get an early start, enroll in a summer course. Summer courses start June 5th.

Paying for College



Allen Community College is focused on being one of the most affordable Kansas community colleges and maintains rates of tuition, fees, and room and board that are among the lowest in the state. Your first step to secure financial aid is to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Apply online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. To expedite the process, designate Allen Community College as your school of choice on the FAFSA form. The results will be sent directly to our Financial Aid Office. Allen's school code number is 001901.

Scholarships

Presidential Academic Scholarship

Pays tuition, student fees, and book rental for up to 18 credit hours per semester and can be renewed with a 3.75 GPA. Criteria: Currently participating in Allen's Concurrent Enrollment Program or a graduate of a Kansas high school with a 3.75 GPA and above. Must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours at the beginning of the semester. Apply by August 1st for the Fall semester.

Dean's Academic Scholarship

Pays tuition and book rental for up to 18 credit hours per semester and can be renewed with a 3.5 GPA. Criteria: Currently participating in Allen's Concurrent Enrollment Program or a graduate of a Kansas high school with a 3.5 to 3.74 GPA. Must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours at the beginning of the semester. Apply by August 1st for the Fall semester.

Merit Academic Scholarship

\$500 per semester and can be renewed with a 3.0 GPA. Criteria: Currently participating in Allen's Concurrent Enrollment Program or a graduate from a Kansas high school with a 3.0-3.49 GPA. Must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours at the beginning of the semester. Apply by August 1st for the Fall semester.

Accreditation

Allen Community College is accredited by The Higher Learning Commission (HLC), a commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools and the Kansas Board of Regents. To be considered for online accreditation, programs must have at least 50 percent of their required courses available in the online environment.

The Higher Learning Commission conducted an onsite visit to Allen on October 9-10, 2011, to evaluate its application request to offer associate degrees through distance education. The site visit team submitted its report in December, recommending full approval of the request. Allen received official notification from HLC of the approval on February 22, 2012.

Allen received approval to offer all AA, AS, AGS, and AAS degrees online. Some popular programs are Allied Health, Addictions Counseling, Criminal Justice, and Early Childhood Education. Certificate programs are also available.



Allen's General Education courses – Art to Biology to Physical Sciences to Sociology to Accounting to Theatre – are university-parallel, providing that solid foundation for when you complete your Associate's degree and transfer on to earn your baccalaureate degree.

Allen's Career and Technical Education courses – Allied Health to Addictions Counseling to Business to Criminal Justice to Early Childhood – focus on industry-based competencies, preparing you for a 21st Century career.
